## UPDATE OF 1999 HONOLULU BICYCLE MASTER PLAN TO INCLUDE ALL OF O'AHU

The City and County of Honolulu's Department of Transportation Services is updating the 1999 Honolulu Bicycle Master Plan. The new plan will cover the entire island of O'ahu and will guide future planning to better integrate bicycling into the island's transportation system. The updated plan will inventory and assess current conditions as well as identify new routes and priorities. Ensuring bike-accessible transit stations will be an important component of the new plan.

The success of the plan update will depend on the level of public involvement in identifying routes, establishing priorities and assisting in the evaluation of supporting plans and policies.

## BICYCLE ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Bicycle Advisory Committee (BAC) will be involved in the planning process from start to finish. Members of the BAC include:
